- Yes, certainly. Brazil is the largest country in South America and the world's fifth largest country. It is bounded by the Atlantic Ocean on the east and has a long coastline. It shares borders with 11 countries and the largest are Venezuela and Colombia to the north, Peru, Bolivia and Paraguay to the west and Uruguay to the south.
- So Paul, what language is spoken in Brazil?
- The official language is Portuguese and it is spoken by 99% of the population but there are some native languages spoken as well.
- You mentioned the population.
- Yes, the estimated population of Brazil is over 199 million. The majority of people are of European descent at 55%, about 38% claim to be Mestizo which is a combination of European and Native American descent. The remaining population is of Indian and African descent.
- How fascinating.
- Yes, did you know that the second largest river runs through Brazil?
- Yes, the Amazon River, of course.
- Yes, you are right. So around 60% of the Amazon rainforest is located in Brazil. It is home to a wide range of animals; jaguars and pumas are found in Brazil.
- That's very interesting. Thank you very much, indeed.

What will the future bring?

In today's programme we are presenting our survey findings regarding predictions for the future. We have asked 20 000 smartphone users for their views on what they are most excited about in relation to future technology.

One key finding was 'wearable technology'. Our respondents think that technology will be so small you should be able to wear it. Your phone, for example, will always be on you.

Smarter cars being developed was another prediction – smarter meaning self-driving cars. It's about time, they say, that cars could just be programmed to take you to a desired destination.

Another interesting thing was smarter screens, so thin that you will be able to fold them or roll them up. Also, many respondents are excited about seeing Artificial Intelligence robots in everyday use. Then, we had holograms in everyday phones and tablets. Several people described wanting to see hologram messages and calls in the future.

All respondents agreed that short battery life was frustrating and was one of the biggest problems phone users have with technology right now. Longer battery life must be on everyone's top agenda. And finally, need for speed was one of the recurring responses in the survey. We want to receive and send data faster, faster, faster. More power and more speed.
